In 2010, Fée's children Jonathan, Catherine and Megan expanded Ardmore's horizons by venturing into the realm of fabric design, giving rise to Ardmore Home, and ultimately Ardmore Fashion several years later. By translating their iconic ceramic designs onto silk. linen and cotton, the brand found new avenues for creative expression, garnering attention from renowned designers and artists. This expansion further solidified the brand's presence in the luxury market, heralding collaborations with prestigious names like Hermès.



With a team of over 70 artists, Ardmore remains committed to economic empowerment and the preservation of African artistic traditions. Their products, characterised by vibrant colours, intricate patterns, and rich storytelling, serve as a bridge between cultures, inviting dialogue and appreciation for African heritage.
