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

TABLE MOUNTAIN CABLEWAY TURNS 95

The Table Mountain Aerial Cableway celebrates 95 years of providing unforgettable experiences. Since its opening in 1929, the Cableway has undergone three major upgrades, becoming a must-see attraction in Cape Town. Initially proposed as a railway in the 1870s, the project evolved into a cableway in 1926, thanks to Norwegian engineer Trygve Stromsoe. Over the years, it has welcomed millions of visitors, including celebrities like Oprah Winfrey, Arnold Schwarzenegger, and Sir Edmund Hillary. Today, the Cableway remains a beloved icon, transporting around a million visitors annually, with many more adventures on the horizon.

SUN CITY ICON REBORN

Sun City's legendary hotel is being revitalised, blending rich Tswana culture with modern luxury. Originally opened in 1979, the iconic Sun City Hotel captured South Africa's imagination and later expanded with The Cascades, The Cabanas, and The Palace. Now, with an upgrade led by Blacksmith Interior Inspiration, the hotel will feature bespoke interiors paying homage to its unique surroundings. "The design combines comfort with craft," says director Ryan Ilgner, highlighting details like Tswana-inspired woven patterns, warm savannah tones, and Pilanesberg-themed artwork. The first refreshed rooms opened in time for the Nedbank Golf Challenge that took place in November 2024, inviting guests into an authentic African experience.

estled just an hour's drive from Cape Town, the South African Winelands is more than a destination; it's an experience that indulges every sense. Known for its world-class vineyards, charming small towns, and diverse culinary scene, the Winelands is a must-see for anyone who appreciates fine wine, gourmet dining, and breathtaking landscapes. With so much to offer, planning a trip here is about balancing leisurely indulgence with the thrill of discovery.

WHEN TO GO

The Winelands is delightful year-round, but the best time to visit is between late summer and autumn, from February to April. This period coincides with the grape harvest season, when the vineyards are full of life, and wine estates buzz with activity. Winter (June to August) offers a quieter charm, with fireside tastings and fewer crowds – perfect for those who appreciate a cosy getaway. Spring (September to November) bursts with wildflowers and new growth, making the scenery even more vibrant.



SIP, SAVOUR, AND EXPLORE

Wine tasting in the Winelands is more than sampling a vintage; it's a journey through centuries-old vineyards, family-run estates, and cutting-edge cellars. Each region offers something unique, from the robust reds of Stellenbosch to the crisp whites of Durbanville.

Stellenbosch is often the first stop, offering iconic estates like Quoin Rock, a

must-visit for its remarkable Sauvignon Blanc and bold Bordeaux-style blends. Set against the Simonsberg mountains, Quoin Rock combines modern architecture with historic charm, creating an atmosphere that's both sophisticated and welcoming. A tasting here is as much about the wines as it is about the stunning views and meticulously designed spaces. For a truly immersive experience, try a pairing at



Gåte Restaurant on-site, where inventive dishes complement the estate's finest vintages, elevating every sip and bite.

Franschhoek is another gem, known as the culinary capital of the region. Hop on the Franschhoek Wine Tram - a charming, hop-on-hop-off service that takes you to a selection of the area's best vineyards, from the classic elegance of La Motte to the family-friendly, picnic-ready grounds of Mont Rochelle. Franschhoek's Huguenot heritage has shaped its wines and cuisine, blending French sophistication with South African heart.

Paarl offers a slightly off-the-beatentrack experience, with Fairview being a must-visit for its combination of wines and artisanal cheeses. For those interested in the production side, the KWV Emporium in Paarl offers cellar tours that delve into the art of brandy and gin alongside their renowned wine selection.

WHERE TO EAT

In Franschhoek, Le Quartier Français boasts Protégé, a casually elegant eatery where you'll find refined yet unpretentious seasonal dishes that celebrate local ingredients. For a true treat, La Petite Colombe offers multi-course tasting menus that rival the best in Europe, set against stunning vineyard views.

Stellenbosch shines with Jordan Restaurant at Jordan Wine Estate, where Chef George Jardine's flair for seasonal, farm-to-table dishes pairs beautifully with the estate's wines. For an innovative experience, Dusk in Stellenbosch is making waves with its multi-sensory

approach to dining. At Dusk, chefs Darren Badenhorst and Callan Austin take you on a journey of textures, tastes, and scents in a menu that pushes culinary boundaries.

Paarl's Terra Mare is a local favourite, serving Italian-inspired cuisine with a South African influence. Pair your meal with wines from the nearby estates, and you're in for a memorable experience.

STAYING IN STYLE

From five-star luxury lodges to quaint guesthouses, the Winelands' accommodation options reflect the region's warm hospitality and rich heritage.

Delaire Graff Estate in Stellenbosch offers top-tier luxury with its exclusive lodges featuring private plunge pools and unobstructed vineyard views. For those who want a more immersive experience, Babylonstoren in Franschhoek is a unique working farm where you can wander

through their impressive gardens, relax in the spa, and even help with seasonal farming activities if you're feeling adventurous.

For a more budget-friendly option, De Hoek Manor in Stellenbosch is a beautifully restored guesthouse with an old-world charm, offering easy access to the town's restaurants and wine estates.

If you're looking for something ecofriendly, Boschendal Wine Estate offers luxury tents for a glamping experience like no other, blending rustic charm with modern comforts amidst sprawling vineyard and mountain views.

BEYOND THE VINEYARDS

While wine is the star of the show, the Winelands offers more than just vineyards. Stellenbosch is a town worth exploring with its oak-lined avenues, art galleries, and historic buildings. The Stellenbosch Village Museum is a time

REWRITING THE NARRATIVE

Kiara Scott Farmer - 2024 Diners Club Winemaker of the Year

In the heart of South Africa's wine country, Kiara Scott Farmer's journey is rewriting history. As the youngest female head winemaker in South Africa and the 2024 Diners Club Winemaker of the Year, her story is a compelling mix of resilience, ambition, and exceptional talent. Born and raised in Mitchells Plain, a township on the Cape Flats, Kiara's rise to prominence is a testament to the power of determination.

itchells Plain is not where one would expect to find the beginnings of a winemaking career. Growing up amidst the socioeconomic challenges of gangsterism, drug and alcohol abuse, and violence, Kiara was determined to break free from the cycles that entrapped so many in her community.

Her curiosity about wine emerged in a most unlikely environment. "While growing up, I didn't want to be like some of the people I was used to seeing – impoverished, aimlessly hanging around on street corners, intoxicated. It was in this environment

that I became curious about wine - how it was made, what it could represent," Kiara recalls.

Despite initial resistance from her family, who struggled to understand her career choice, Kiara pursued her passion, enrolling at Elsenburg Agricultural Training Institute to study Oenology and Viticulture. Later, she augmented her knowledge with business studies at the University of Cape Town's Graduate School of Business.

Her entry into the wine world was anything but typical, but her tenacity and refusal to conform to societal expectations set her on the path to greatness.







MAKING OF A VISIONARY WINEMAKER

While at Elsenburg, Kiara's talent was recognised by the prestigious Cape Winemakers Guild (CWG) Protégé Programme. This opportunity provided her with unparalleled mentorship, connecting her with some of South Africa's most accomplished winemakers. Among them was Duncan Savage, who saw in Kiara not only immense potential but also an unrelenting passion for the craft.

Under Duncan's guidance, Kiara joined Brookdale Estate as an assistant winemaker, where they collaborated on the estate's maiden vintage, the 2017 Brookdale Chenin Blanc. This wine set a new benchmark for elegance and terroir-driven complexity, establishing Brookdale as a rising star in South Africa's wine scene.

By 2019, Kiara had taken over as Brookdale's sole winemaker at just 26, becoming the youngest head female winemaker in the country. This milestone was celebrated widely, and in 2022, the Western Cape Provincial Parliament formally congratulated her achievements, stating she serves as an inspiration for young women everywhere.

CRAFTING AN AWARD-WINNING CHENIN BLANC

Kiara's dedication to minimal intervention winemaking and her meticulous attention to detail culminated in the creation of the 2022 Brookdale Old Vine Chenin Blanc, the wine that secured her the Diners Club Winemaker of the Year Award. The Chenin Blanc was crafted from old vines planted in 1985 on decomposed shale and granite soils, showcasing a terroir that Kiara describes as "stony and resilient."

The grapes were hand-picked in stages to optimise ripeness, then aged for 22 months in a combination of 500-litre barrels and 2,000-litre Austrian oak foudres. Despite the challenges posed by the warmer 2022 vintage, the wine retained remarkable elegance, concentration, and acidity.

Tasting notes describe the wine as "subtly keyed, with restrained aromatics of pear skin, honeycomb, and golden







citrus. The palate is deep, concentrated, and layered, with yellow apples, kumquat, and peaches balanced by a savoury finish." For Kiara, the wine reflects the unique story of the vines, the vintage, and her team's unwavering dedication.

For Kiara, winemaking is about more than just crafting exceptional wines. It's about storytelling, showcasing a specific site and vintage, and working with a passionate team to bring the vision to life.

"One of the most rewarding elements of my job is watching and guiding grapes turn into wine, expressing their unique character," Kiara shares. She takes equal pride in mentoring her team and witnessing their growth, knowing that her leadership extends far beyond the cellar.

CHALLENGES AND TRIUMPHS

As a young woman in a male-dominated industry, Kiara has faced her share of challenges. However, she sees her achievements as a way to break stereotypes and inspire others. "When I decided on my career, my family wasn't too pleased. They wondered where I even came up with this idea,"

she recalls with a laugh. But their initial doubts were no match for Kiara's determination to defy expectations.

Her journey has also reshaped perceptions of South African winemaking, bringing diversity to an industry steeped in tradition.

CULTIVATING A LEGACY

Kiara's ambitions for the future

are as bold as her achievements. "An important goal for me is acquiring my own farm," she reveals, envisioning a space where she can continue to innovate and inspire others.


She is also deeply committed to sustainability, both in her winemaking practices and in the industry's growth as a whole. By focusing on the unique characteristics of South African terroir,

Judging the 2024 Diners Club Winemaker of the Year & Young Winemaker of the Year

The annual Diners Club Winemaker of the Year and Young Winemaker of the Year awards continue to be benchmarks of excellence in South African viticulture. These prestigious accolades honour innovation, skill, and the enduring passion that defines the country's wine industry. This year's awards, focusing on Chenin Blanc for the Winemaker category and "any red wine" for the Young Winemaker category, were judged by an accomplished panel of experts. Their insights reflect both the evolution of South African wines and the unique strengths of the respective categories.

CARRIE ADAMS

Panel Chair

Carrie Adams is an esteemed wine aficionado and broadcaster with decades of experience in wine evaluation. Known for her sharp palate and engaging discussions about wine, she has chaired numerous prestigious competitions.

"Chenin Blanc is a quintessential South African grape," says Adams. "Once relegated to brandy production, it has become a beacon of versatility and quality. This year, we judged 115 entries, each representing a unique interpretation of this workhorse varietal. From tropical fruit-driven styles to oaked, textured expressions, the diversity was extraordinary. The winning wine embodies the elegance and vibrancy that Chenin Blanc offers."

Adams revels in the boldness of young winemakers: "This year's red wine entries displayed fearless innovation. These are wines made by brave young Turks who challenge convention and reimagine what's possible. Judging this category is always a joy, as it showcases the dynamic creativity driving the future of South African wine."







YEGAS NAIDOO

Judge

Yegas Naidoo, a connoisseur with a hospitality and fine dining background, has been instrumental in promoting South African wines on the global stage. Her expertise lies in identifying wines with balance, quality, and potential.

"The Chenin Blanc category was exceptional this year," Naidoo remarks. "Winemakers are delving deeper into terroir, creating wines that tell stories of place and time. This varietal's capacity for freshness and complexity was on full display."

Naidoo admires the risk-taking spirit of the entrants: "Young winemakers are embracing uncharted paths while maintaining quality and elegance. Their creations reflect a confident evolution of style that promises a bright future for South African wines."



WINNIE BOWMAN

Judge

Winnie Bowman, a Cape Wine Master and experienced international wine judge, brings a wealth of knowledge from her years in the industry. Her passion lies in exploring how winemaking techniques elevate varietals to global prominence.

"Chenin Blanc is enjoying its time in the spotlight, and rightly so," says Bowman. "This year's entries showcased everything from accessible everyday

wines to premium, age-worthy icons. It's clear that South African winemakers have honed their craft, producing expressions that capture the grape's full potential."

Bowman celebrates the entrants' creativity in the Young Winemaker competition: "These young winemakers are crafting exciting blends and varietals, often with grapes new to South Africa. Their work reflects a fusion of tradition and innovation that's energising the industry."

DENZEL SWARTS

Judge

A rising star in the South African wine industry, Denzel Swarts champions sustainable winemaking and terroir-driven authenticity. His focus is on fostering respect for the earth in every bottle.

"This year's Chenin Blanc entries displayed harmony between vibrant fruit expression and sophisticated structure," Swarts explains. "The wines reflect a growing respect for terroir and the artistry of winemaking."

Swarts was also inspired by the young winemakers' entries' bold experimentation: "These young winemakers are not just pushing boundaries; they're redefining them. Their respect for the land and willingness to innovate will keep South Africa's wine industry ahead of the curve."





SHANE MUMBA

Judge

Shane Mumba, known for his expertise in marketing and branding in the wine sector, focuses on how wines express authenticity and tell compelling stories.

Mumba describes the Chenin Blanc entries as "the workhorse wine that became the race horse", and adds "it was no easy job judging some of the best Chenins because the diversity in style made them very difficult to identify."

Mumba finds the creativity of the young winemakers invigorating: "I am always excited to taste the young winemakers' wines. We are fortunate to have talented young winemakers in South Africa that are passionate and ready to push boundaries. The red wines we tasted were vibrant, full of character but yet elegant."

JOHANN FOURIE

Judge

Johann Fourie, a winemaker with years of experience crafting award-winning

wines, brings a technical perspective to the judging process. His focus is on craftsmanship and terroir expression.

"Chenin Blanc continues to be a flagbearer for South African wines," says Fourie. "This year's entries displayed exceptional quality across the board, making the judging process as challenging as it was rewarding."

Fourie views the Young Winemaker category as a window into the future: "The creativity and technical skill of these young winemakers are extraordinary. Their ability to innovate while honouring tradition speaks volumes about the bright future of South African wine."

The 2024 Diners Club awards underline South Africa's winemaking prowess and the creativity that sets it apart globally. The judges' insights reveal a thriving industry rooted in tradition but unafraid to embrace bold, forward-thinking approaches. With winners soon to be revealed, one thing is certain: South African wine is in the hands of extraordinary talent.

Celebrating the 2024 Diners Club Winemaker of the Year Finalists

The Diners Club Winemaker of the Year award has been synonymous with excellence, innovation, and passion in South African winemaking for 44 years. This year's finalists in the masters category embody these qualities, each bringing a unique approach and vision to their craft. From revitalising forgotten vineyards to pushing the boundaries of terroir expression, these winemakers tell stories not just through their words, but through the wines they create.

s 2024 Diners Club Winemaker of the Year finalists, Pierre Wahl, Louis van der Riet, Tertius Boshoff, Henri Swiegers, and Ben Snyman represent the pinnacle of South African winemaking. Each finalist has a unique story, a signature approach, and a commitment to crafting wines that resonate on a personal and cultural level.

PIERRE WAHL

Crafting Complexity in the Cape
Born in Port Elizabeth, Pierre Wahl's

path to winemaking began with a deep love for nature. Though initially drawn to nature conservation, it was his father's enthusiasm for agriculture that steered him toward viticulture. "I wanted to be creative, tour the world, and meet interesting people – winemaking ticked all the boxes," he reflects.

A graduate of Elsenburg Agricultural College, Pierre has spent decades refining his approach to Chenin Blanc, a varietal close to his heart. His proudest moment? Winning the Diners Club Winemaker of the Year award in 2016 with a Chenin Blanc

from Tulbagh.

Pierre's finalist wine, the Survivor Terroir Chenin Blanc 2023, exemplifies his innovative spirit. Teaming up with viticulturist DB Rust, Pierre experimented with leaf removal and sunlight exposure in the vineyards. The result? A complex, rich wine showcasing natural yeast fermentation. "It's rewarding to create something that puts a smile on consumers' faces," he says.

Looking ahead, Pierre dreams of making Survivor Wines a household name while consistently producing





wines of exceptional quality.

BEN SNYMAN

Fuelled by Creativity and Connection

A Stellenbosch native with a BSc in Viticulture and Oenology, Ben Snyman embodies a balance of adventure and artistry in winemaking. His diverse studies, including leadership programmes at Harvard Business School and advanced courses at the Cape Wine Academy, highlight his dedication to mastering his craft.

Ben's proudest moments come from the daily fulfilment of crafting wines that bring happiness to others. His finalist wine, the 2021 Survivor Reserve Chenin Blanc, created with minimal intervention, allows the natural appeal of fruit and texture to shine through. "It's about examining what lies beneath the surface and creating something artistic," he explains. His attention to detail and commitment to authenticity ensure that every bottle tells a unique story of its own, making each sip a new experience for the drinker.

Looking forward, Ben hopes to draw on his life experiences to fuel his creativity in the cellar, always striving





ensuring that his wines remain authentic expressions of their origins.

TERTIUS BOSHOFF

Old Vines, New Stories

Swellendam-born Tertius Boshoff describes winemaking as both a calling and an art form. His passion for creativity, combined with a meticulous nature, has made him a standout in the industry.

"Winemaking is art," he says. "It's about painting stories inside a bottle."

Tertius achieved his proudest moment in 2023 when he won the Diners Club Winemaker of the Year award for his Blueberry Hill Shiraz 2020. His 2024 finalist wine, the Stellenrust Secrets & Lies Chenin Blanc, honours old-vine heritage, with grapes harvested from

a vineyard planted in 1982. The wine is crafted with minimal interference, allowing the unique character of the 43-year-old vines to shine.

For Tertius, the smiles of wine drinkers as they savour his creations are the ultimate reward. He's equally passionate about mentoring younger winemakers, fostering a culture of

for superior quality and to continuously push the boundaries of winemaking.

LOUIS VAN DER RIET

A Chenin Blanc Revivalist

Hailing from Kimberley, Louis van der Riet's journey into winemaking was somewhat serendipitous. Sunday lunches with his family often featured a sip of wine and lively discussions about its flavours, sparking a lifelong fascination with the transformation of grapes into art. "The idea that something as simple as a grape could become a work of art felt like magic," he recalls.

After studying Viticulture and Oenology at Elsenburg Stellenbosch, Louis founded Le Sueur Wines. His finalist wine, the 2022 Le Sueur Kluisenaar, is a testament to his dedication. Crafted from Chenin Blanc grapes grown in Meiringspoort, a challenging yet rewarding terroir, this wine celebrates resilience. "The block was abandoned, but we revived it," he says.

For Louis, the connection between the land, the vineyard, and the people who enjoy his wines is deeply rewarding. He balances innovation with tradition,











learning and innovation. "The only thing they need to do is ask questions," he advises.

HENRI SWIEGERS

A Legacy of Passion

For Henri Swiegers, winemaking runs in the family. Raised in Robertson and educated at Augsburg Agricultural School, Henri spent his childhood immersed in cellar life alongside his father, a winemaker. "Wine was part of growing up, so I guess you could say it was passed down to me," he notes.

Henri's finalist wine, the 2023 Badsberg Chenin Blanc Barrel Ferment, exemplifies his dedication to balance and harmony. Sourced from 34-year-old bush vines, this wine marries fruit and wood seamlessly, delivering a complex yet approachable profile.

Throughout his career, Henri has earned numerous accolades, including four General Smuts trophies, but his greatest joy lies in seeing others enjoy his wines. He is committed to mentoring the next generation, ensuring that South Africa's wine industry continues to thrive.



WINEMAKING'S RISING STAR

Mika Engelbrecht – 2024 Diners Club Young Winemaker of the Year

At just 27 years old, Mika Engelbrecht has not only secured her position as the head winemaker at Stellenbosch's iconic Neethlingshof Estate but has also clinched the prestigious 2024 Diners Club Young Winemaker of the Year award. 


orn and raised in the coastal town of Hermanus, Mika's journey into winemaking was almost serendipitous. She pursued a BSc in Viticulture and Oenology at Stellenbosch University, combining her love for science and nature. Later, she broadened her knowledge by completing a course in *The Business of Wine* at the University of Cape Town's Business School. Her academic foundation laid the groundwork for what has become a deeply fulfilling career in winemaking.

Yet, Mika's entry into the world of wine was not premeditated. "To be honest, it kind of chose me," she says. The opportunity to merge science with art and embrace the dynamic challenges of seasonal variations ignited her passion for the field. "It's not your average nine-to-five job," she adds, reflecting on the unpredictable yet rewarding nature of her chosen path.

A HOMECOMING AT NEETHLINGSHOF

Mika's connection to Neethlingshof runs deep. She first worked at the estate during the 2019 harvest as part of her final-year practical studies. Little did she know that she would return a few







years later, this time as head winemaker, tasked with shaping the future of one of Stellenbosch's most historic wineries.

Her return to Neethlingshof marked a proud moment in her career. "As a 27-year-old, I would have never thought I'd be given the opportunity to be a winemaker at one of the most historic wine farms in Stellenbosch," she says. This role has allowed her to channel her creativity and leadership into crafting wines that honour the estate's rich heritage while pushing the boundaries of modern winemaking.

CRAFTING AN AWARD-WINNING CABERNET SAUVIGNON

The 2024 Diners Club Young Winemaker of the Year award recognised Mika for her 2022 Estate Range Cabernet Sauvignon, a wine that exemplifies her meticulous approach to winemaking. The grapes for this wine were harvested from a west-facing block planted in 2011, situated 140 metres above sea level. The soil—a combination of decomposed granite and Table Mountain sandstone—and the block's proximity to the ocean contribute to the wine's exceptional terroir expression.

After being harvested at 25 Balling, the grapes underwent fermentation in a roto tank before malolactic fermentation in stainless steel tanks. The wine was then aged for 12 months in a combination of French and American oak barrels, 40% of which were new. The result is a Cabernet Sauvignon with intense concentration, vibrant fruit characteristics, and a remarkable balance between structure and elegance.

Mika describes the wine as a true reflection of its terroir. "There is a lot of hard work, passion, and attention to detail that goes into creating any wine, but Cabernet Sauvignon in Stellenbosch is a match made in heaven," she says.

THE JOY OF THE CRAFT

For Mika, the most rewarding part of her role is seeing the winemaking process



through from grape to glass. "Working alongside an incredible team and knowing that the final product is enjoyed by family, friends, and fellow wine enthusiasts is incredibly fulfilling," she says.

Her winemaking philosophy centres on collaboration and respect for nature. Neethlingshof's sustainability initiatives, such as their owl boxes for natural pest control and the conservation of native renosterveld, resonate deeply with her. These practices enhance the quality of the wines and underscore the estate's commitment to environmental stewardship.

LOOKING AHEAD

Despite her already impressive achievements, Mika remains humble and focused on the journey ahead. Her goals are simple yet profound: to continue learning, enjoy the process, and strive to produce even greater wines. This dedication to her craft ensures that she remains at the forefront of South Africa's winemaking scene.

As the winemaker at Neethlingshof,

Mika is uniquely positioned to shape the future of an estate steeped in history while embracing innovation. Her work celebrates the delicate balance between tradition and modernity, science and art – a balance that defines her wines and her career.

Mika Engelbrecht's rise in the wine industry is a story of talent, perseverance, and a deep respect for the craft. Her award-winning 2022 Cabernet Sauvignon is a testament to her ability to harness the unique characteristics of Stellenbosch's terroir and translate them into wines of exceptional quality.





Published in 1980 as John Platter's Book of South African Wines, the first "Platter's" was 119 pages long and featured the wines of 171 producers and brands, from Aan de Doorns Co-Operative to Zonnheimer. There were also explanations about how to serve, store and taste wine, South Africa's wine-growing regions and its certification system.

In his foreword, Platter acknowledged his wife Erica had had the idea for the guide, adding "her verve and tenacity in helping to gather and sift information made this a joint venture." Interestingly, Erica and the current MD and editor, Philip van Zyl, are the only two to edit the guide in its 45-year history.

Van Zyl took over from the 1999 edition following its sale by the Platters. Not only does his 27^w edition run to 720 pages, but it features nearly 9,000 locally produced wines (as well as brandies, husk spirits/grappa and sherry-style wines) and shares insights about the 900 brand owners who grow, make and sell them - from Aaldering to Zorgvliet. (Aan de Doorns still features in the guide - just after Aaldering - but Zonnheimer no longer exists.)

Also, there is all the information wine lovers need to get to grips with the industry, its geography and legislation, its grape varieties and wine styles, and its vintages, as well as those organisations that support the growers and producers. Most importantly for the industry and Platterati alike, there are the upfront pages listing those wines that have received their highest accolade, a five-star rating.

Annually, Platter's assesses a potential 9,000 wines. Those rated 93 points or



more on the 100-point rating scale by the sighted judges are entered into a second round of blind tasting. Here, two tasters, assisted by a second-opinion taster if necessary, assess the wines to award them their final rating. Bottlings judged to be "Superlative, a South African classic", are given the highest ranking of five stars, equal to 95 points or more. Of the five-star-awarded wines, the top performer within each wine style receives the coveted accolade of Wine of the Year. Then there are the three Winery of the Year awards: Top Performing Winery of the Year (the winery that achieves the most five-star results); Newcomer Winery of the Year (the producer debuting in the guide and achieving highest ratings at the five-star tasting), and Editor's Award Winery of the Year (recognising a winegrowing team/ teams who are ambassadors par excellence for South African wine). In the 45th edition, these awards go to Sadie Family Wines, Terra Loci and Hamilton Russell Vineyards, respectively.

WHERE TO FIND PLATTER'S BY DINERS CLUB

Distributed nationwide, there's the iconic hardcover version, now nearly 4 cm thick versus 1980's 1/2½cm. Less visible perhaps, but equally valuable to the wine lover, are the digital versions of the guide – the website (wineonaplatter.com), the apps and e-books.

With a range of value-added features such as advanced search, news, shopping and information about wine country accommodation, specialist tour operators and dining options among the vines, the web-based version is the flagship.

For those who like the look of the hardcover but prefer a digital experience, there is the e-book. Downloadable to any device that runs the Kindle free e-reader app, it looks exactly like the book, and offers benefits inherent in the electronic format, like bookmarking, search, multiple navigation options, and hyperlinked

websites and email addresses.

Serving as your digital sommelier, the apps provide the quickest and most direct access to the wine descriptions and ratings. Also, with a single tap, you can see which wineries are in your area and get directions to the venue of your choice via the built-in map.

stylish 22" alloys. The quiet, refined cabin, enhanced by active noise cancellation, creates an almost meditative experience for drivers and passengers alike.

Unlike some electric SUVs, the EX90 doesn't sacrifice interior space. Its flexible three-row layout accommodates up to seven adults comfortably, with clever storage solutions and fold-flat seating options for added versatility.

The seats, upholstered in luxurious yet sustainable materials, offer exceptional

support. The panoramic glass roof amplifies the sense of openness, though an interior cover would be welcome in warmer conditions.

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
